HOLY CROSS P.T.O. 2025 SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

On Tuesday, September 16th, our Holy Cross Parish volunteers delivered all school supply items collected over the summer to Hamtramck High School on Charest Street for their 1080 students. We were met by Corlis Brown-Lloyd and Hane Dreshaj, School and Community Facilitators, who helped us to unload our two vehicles. This was our P.T.O.'s 19th year of sponsoring the drive and the third rotation to the High School. Once again, we surpassed even our own expectations!

(Items collected: 105 backpacks, 117 2" binders, 1194 pens, 162 boxes colored pencils, 651 pink erasers, 641 pencil pouches, 221 packs sticky notes, 500 highlighters, 277 pencil sharpeners, 2612 pencils, 50 5-tab insertable dividers, 320 notebooks, 600 folders, 195 packs personal wipes, 52 planners, 18 scarves. For the HS unhoused students: 416 protein bars, 50 deodorants, 18 t-shirts, 11 Crocs, 50 winter hats.)

Once again, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our wonderful Holy Cross volunteers who either donated funds, purchased items, packed boxes, or helped to deliver the supplies. We especially thank those who allowed us to use their vehicles for the trip. With the help of our parishioners, we filled a truck and an SUV on Sunday after Mass. Our delivery team: JoHanna Banicki, the Chockley family including Stephanie Marsh, Frank Hogness, Kevin Hogness, and myself.
