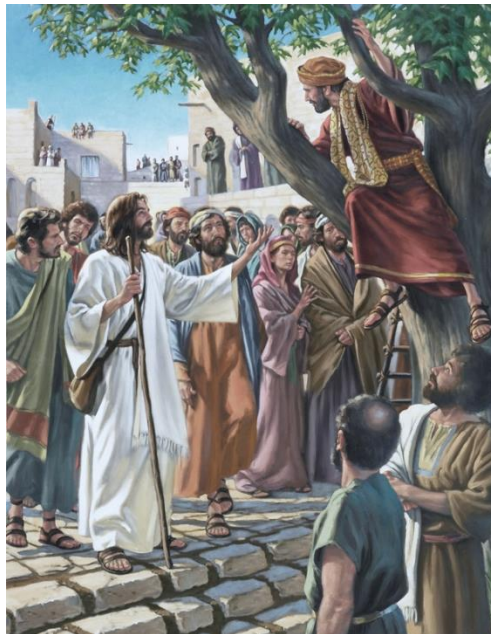

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." Pobiegł więc naprzód i wspiął się na sykomorę, aby móc Go ujrzyć, tamtędy bowiem miał przechodzić. Gdy Jezus przyszedł na to miejsce, spojrzał w górę i rzekł do niego: „Zacheuszu, zejdz prędko, albowiem dziś muszę się zatrzymać w twoim domu”. Zeszedł więc z pośpiechem i przyjął Go rozradowany. A wszyscy widząc to szemrali: „Do grzesznika poszedł w gościnę”. Lecz Zacheusz stanął i rzekł do Pana: „Panie, oto połowę mego majątku daję ubogim, a jeśli kogo w czym skrzywdziłem, zwracam poczwórnje”. Na to Jezus rzekł do niego: „Dziś zbawienie stało się udziałem tego domu, gdyż i on jest synem Abrahama. Albowiem Syn Człowieczy przyszedł szukać i zbawić to, co zginęło”.
